
A CONVERSATION ABOUT PEACEBUILDING IN THE HOLY LAND

Speakers include the Rev. Dr. Mae Cannon, executive director of Churches for Middle East Peace, and Tamar Haddad, the Coordinator at Churches for Middle East Peace's women empowerment program: And Still We Rise (ASWR). Dr. Cannon is the author of several publications about the conflict including A Land Full of God: Christian Perspectives toward the Holy Land (Cascade, 2017). Tamar Haddad is based in Jerusalem and previously served as the Project Manager for Gender Justice at the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL).

Formed in 1984, Churches for Middle East Peace (<u>cmep.org</u>) is a coalition of national church denominations and organizations working to encourage U.S. policies that actively promote just, lasting and comprehensive resolutions to conflicts in the Middle East.


To God Be the Glory


